Cess Committee has recommended that speculation in shellac through the Calcutta Shellac Exchange, Ltd, be banned and that forward trading in shellac be regulated under the Forward Contracts Regulation Act. The Government have also invited the views of the Governments Bihar and Madhya Pradesh which are the chief lac producing States. Their replies are awaited. The Indian Lac Cess Committee has further emphasised the importance of increasing consumption of shellac in India reducing dependence on export. Government of Bihar have also appointed a Sub-Committee to go into the question at the State level, suggesting remedial measures.

MINOR IRRIGATION WORKS

- 857. Shri K. G. Deshmukh: (a) Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state whether the Government of India have received any scheme regarding the minor irrigation works from the Government of Madhya Pradesh in their State during the current year?
- (b) Is it a fact that one and a half crores of rupees have been sanctioned to the above-mentioned State as a loan, for the minor irrigation works?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) Yes Sir.

(b) A loan of Rs. 40,45,500 has so far been sanctioned, and proposals for a further loan of Rs. 44 45 lakhs are under consideration.

रेलवे-पुल

८५८. स्वामी रामानस्व शास्त्री : क्या रेल मंत्री यह बतालने की कृपा करेंगे कि:

- (क) क्या सरकार उत्तर प्रदेश में कालभी, मुरादाबाद और बालावाली के रेलवे- पुलों को इस प्रकार का बनाने के लिये पग उठा रही हैं, जिस से वे यातायात की दूसरी सवारियों के लिये भी कार्ययोग्य हो जायें; तथा

The Deputy Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri Alagesan): (a) (i) In the case of the Bridge at Kalpi,

the possibility of permitting private cars to use the road decking on the Bridge during limited intervals in the day-time during the Monsoon season, is under investigation.

- (ii) The Ramganga Bridge at Moradabad already has a cart Roadway provided.
- (iii) In the case of the Bridge at Balawali, there is no road decking existing at present and there is no intention to provide one as the girders would be overstressed.
- (b) The existing girders at Kalpi and Balawali cannot take the additional weight of a normal roadway and therefore the question of modifying these bridges to take general road traffic or authorising the State Government to modify them does not arise.

RAILWAY LAND

- 859. Shri B. N. Kureel: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:
- (a) the extent of surplus land at the sides of Railway tracks which was handed over to the District Magistrate Rae Bareli (U.P.) for leasing out to the cultivators under the "G.M.F." Scheme; and
- (b) the total area of land actually leased out so far?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) 5.65 acres.

(b) This information is not yet available from the State Government as they have not finalised the arrangements for leasing out such lands to cultivators, so far.

FOODGRAINS FOR MADRAS

- 860. Shri Boovaraghasamy: (a) Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state the quantity of foodgrains recently demanded by the Madras State from the Central Government?
- (b) What are the names of food-grains demanded by Madras State?
- (c) What are the names and the quantity of foodgrains so far sent?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) to (c). During the recent discussions held at Bombay, the Government of Madras desired an immediate supply of an extra 20,000 tons of millets and also an advance allotment of 42,000 tons rice against their import quota for

1953. 15,000 tons jower and 18,700 tons rice have been allotted against this request and are being lifted by the State. We are considering the possibility of allotting more rice and utillets to them.

CONVERSION OF LAND INTO COTTON AND SUGAR-CANE GROWING LAND

- 861. Prof. D. C. Sharma: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:
- (a) how many acres of wheat-growing land in the Punjab were converted into cotton and sugarcane growing land during the years 1950, 1951 and 1952; and
- (b) the quantity of additional cotton and sugarcane produced as a result of

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) No net diversion of area from wheat to cotton and sugarcane has taken place in Punjab during 1949-50 to 1951-52, since area under all these crops has been steadily increasing during these years.

- (b) B. C. G. vaccination is not a treatment but a preventive inoculation. During the year 1952 (up to November. 1952) 1.370.863 persons have been tuberculin tested, of whom 384,446 persons, who were found tuberculin-negative, were vaccinated with B. C. G.
