Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether a majority of silver items being sold in the capital are mixed with cheaper metals and neither the police nor the Government are doing anything to clamp down on the trade as reported in Times of India dated November 2, 2002 at page 3;
- (b) if so, the details of the jewellers found guilty during the last three years; and
- (c) the action taken by the Government in this regard?

Answer

The Government is also not empowered under the provisions of the Bureau of Indian Standards Act, 1986 and the Rules framed thereunder, to take appropriate legal action against such unscrupulous traders of silver.
