2. The Committee held its sitting on the 24 th February, 1960. The Committee considered applications for leave of absence from nine members. The recommendation of the Committee with respect to each application is given below :
3. Shri Chowkhamoon Gohain: The member has not been
attending the sittings of the House since the 4 th May, IO:S and has thus completed 60 days of absence on the 28 th November, 1959. On the 21st December, 1959, he sent in ar application for leave of absence statinu chat he was reauired to participate in the planing of the various developmental activities in his constituency and that he was also renuired to undertake tours in N.E.F.A. which is a far flung and difficult hill area. The Committee recommend that the absence of the member for a period of 83 days (i.e. up to the 2lst Decombor: 150 , the date of his application) may be condoned.
4. Shri V.N. Swami: The member has applied for leavo of absence from the Ist December, 1959 to the end of the Ninth Session on account of the illness of his wife. The total period of absence of the member from the Ist December to the 22 nd Docember, 1059, amounted to 22 deys. The Conmittee recommend that leove may be granted to the mermber for thin neriod.

The member has applied for leave of absence for the entire period of the Ninth Session (1 6th November to 22nd December, 1559 ) on the ground of her illness. The Committee recommend that the member may be granted love for this period of 37 days.
