(d) There are 49 fertiliser quality control laboratories in the country including the Central Fertiliser Quality Control and Training Institute at Faridabad with a total analysing capacity of about 88000 samples per annum.

The quality of fertilisers is regulated under the Fertiliser (Control) Order 1985. The standard specifications of various fertilisers have been laid down under this Order. The State Governments are the enforcement authorities and are vested with adequate powers to ensure that farmers are supplied standard quality of fertilisers.

In order to ensure supply of standard pesticides to farmers the State Governments are vested with adequate powers under the Insecticides Act 1961. Laboratories for insecticides have been set up by the Central and State Governments to check the quality of insecticides.
