In consultation with Uinon Territory of Delhi and Chandigarh Rs. 4.5 lakhs and Rs. 4.00 lakhs respectively have been prioritised for schemes for financial assistance during 1990-91.

- (b) During Seventh Plan period and 1990-91, Ministry of Tourism have releose Rs. 81.93 lakhs to Pubjab Government and Rs. 5.00 lakhs to Union Territory of Delhi.
- (c) Release of funds to State Governments and Union Territories is a continuous progess, which depends on the utilisation of funds by concerned state Governments/ Union Territories.
