Private Engineering Colleges

4067. SHRIMATI GEETA MUKHERJEE: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) the number of private engineering colleges in the country and how many of them are unaided and unrecognised by the All India Council for Technical Education;

(b) the reasons for their non-recognition;

(c) whether such colleges do not have the specific and needed equipments and facilities required for imparting technical education;

(d) if so, the steps being taken against such colleges; and

(e) the action, if any, being taken against those promoting such colleges?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) There are 178 engineering colleges under private management, out of which 136 are unaided by the State Governments and not recognised by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE).

(b) These engineering colleges were started without the prior approval of AICTE.

(c) to (e). Such colleges are required to be assessed by the concerned Regional Committees of AICTE in accordance with its norms and standards. The Regional Committee have been advised to assess viability of these colleges. Wherever these colleges are found to be far below the standards, the concerned State Government/Union Territory are advised to take necessary action to close them down. One such college has been closed down on the advice of the AICTE.

(a) the district-wise details of ancient monuments in Bihar preserved by Archaeological Survey of India;

(b) whether funds have been allocated for renovation of those monuments;

(c) if so, the details of the funds allocated during the last two years;

(d) the details of the renovations work completed during this period so far; and

(e) the expenditure incurred thereon?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) A list of ancient monuments in the State of Bihar which are declared of national interest is given in the statement.

(b) and (c). Yes Sir, the funds allocated during the last two years for conservation and maintenance of monuments/sites in the State of Bihar are indicated below:

1988-89 Rs. 26,72,000/-

1989-90 Rs. 20,25,000/-

(d) The conservation and preservation of the monuments is a continuous process, depending on the needs and priorities. During the last two years, some of the special conservation works undertaken at Sasaram, Vaisali Kumrahar, Nalanda, Rajgir, Antichak,

Nandangarh and Malik Sarai. The works carried out in these monuments and sites included repairs to pathways, floorings, causeways, reconstruction of collapsed walls, underpinning and watertightening the structures, providing fencing, improving the drainage and development of the premises of the monuments, etc.

(e) The expenditure incurred for conservation and maintenance of monuments in the State of Bihar are:—
