Nuclear Power Plant in Bihar 4212. SHRI L.V. SINGH: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware of acute shortage in power generation in Bihar;
- (b) whether Bihar is rich in uranium minerals which are available in huge quantity there; and
- (c) if so, the reasons for not going in for nuclear power plant in Bihar?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOL-OGY (PROF. M.G.K. MENON): (a) The generation in Bihar has been short of the requirement. During 1989-90 and 1990-91 (upto July, 1990), the power supply position in Bihar was as under:

Bihar forms part of the Eastern Grid, However, Bihar has been provided assistance from the Northern Gird, whenever the system conditions permit, during the year 1989-90 and 1990-91 (upto July, 1990) Bihar received 234 MU and 179 MU respectively from the Northern Grid. This was besides the assistance provided to Bihar from the Central Sector stations in the Eastern Region.

- (b) Bihar has got substantial low grade uranium reserves.
- (c) Availability of uranium reserves in an area is not the governing criterion for locating nuclear power stations in the area

as the quantity of uranium to be transported for operating a nuclear power station is small unlike coal which is needed in the case of thermal power stations. Eastern Electricity Region of which Bihar is a constituent State, is endowed with coal reserves. The priority is, therefore, for setting up coal fired thermal stations in that region as no long distance transportation of coal is called for; and the priority for setting up of nuclear power plants in Bihar is low. 56: - 5.
