Trade with Afghanistan

*714. Shri K. P. Singh Deo: Will the
Minister of Commerce be pleased to
state:

(a) whether Government are aware
that Pakistan is sending a trade dele-
gation to Afghanistan to boost her
trade;

(b) if so, whether visit of the Pakis-
tani trade delegation will have any
effect on the Indian trade in
Afghanistan; and

(c) if so, the reaction of Govern-
ment thereto?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri
Dinesh Singh): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c). The bulk of our trade
with Afghanistan is on barter
basis. Imports from Afghanistan
are required to be counter-
balanced by export of Indian
goods of equivalent value to that
country. We are aware of Pakistan's
efforts to increase trade with Afgha-
nistan, Pakistan's insistence on the
diversion of Indo-Afghanistan Trade
except fresh fruits from Afghanistan—
via Karachi is adding to the cost of
transport of our goods to Afghanistan.
However we have to make every effort
possible to meet the competition.

The Minister of Commerce (Shri
Dinesh Singh): (a) The Technological
Institute of Textiles, Bhiwani, Haryana
(a Birla concern) has been reported
to have produced sarees shorter in
length than the minimum prescribed
for purposes of controls.

investigation.

The Minister of Steel, Mines and
Metals (Dr. Chenna Reddy): (a) No,
Sir. According to the present indica-
tions, the entire plant is likely to be
commissioned by the end of the fourth
quarter of 1971.
