

Shri D. R. Chavan: बहुत से हैं।

Shri Nath Pai: Is it a fact that there is, on the whole, because of the emergency, a paucity of officers to train personnel; if so, if the answer to this question is "yes", may I know whether the Government are having before them a proposal to recall on a short-term, on a specific term basis the retired officers?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: Persons who are qualified to take the job of instructors have been called back on the services.

Shri Sham Lal Saraf: May I know if training facilities are available for all the armed forces, more particularly after the emergency?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: Yes, Sir.

Shri Hem Barua: May I know if the Government proposes to invite American Missions to train our personnel as disclosed by Shri Patnaik in Washington to the *Baltimore Sun*?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: I am not aware of what exactly Shri Patnaik said there, but it is none of our intention to invite anybody to train our officers.

(ख) यदि हाँ, तो क्या इस कार्य के लिये जवानों का भरतों शुरू हो गई है ; और

(ग) उनका प्रशिक्षण कब तक पूरा हो जायेगा ?

प्रतिरक्षा मंत्रालय में उपमंत्री (श्री 10 रा० चव्हाण) : (क) सरकार ने सेना का वर्तमान शक्ति के अतिरिक्त छः नए डिवीजन खड़े करने की स्वीकृति दी है। वर्तमान डिवीजनों में से एक और चार नए डिवीजन पार्वतीय डिवीजनों के रूप में होंगे।

(ख) जी हाँ।

(ग) प्रशिक्षण यथाशीघ्र सम्पूर्ण करने का हर प्रयत्न किया जा रहा है।

[(a) Government have sanctioned the raising of six new divisions in addition to the existing strength of the Army. One of the existing divisions and four of the new divisions will be in the form of mountain divisions.]

(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) Every effort is being made to complete the training as early as possible.]

श्री सिद्धेश्वर प्रसाद : यह जो नये ६ माउंटेन डिवीजंस बनाये जा रहे हैं यह काफ़ी

हैं या निकट भविष्य में इन को और बढ़ाये जाने की सम्भावना है ?

The Minister of Defence (Shri Y. B. Chavan): This is the present position. If it is necessary, it can certainly be expanded.

श्री सिद्धेश्वर प्रसाद : इन सैनिकों को जो शिक्षा दी जायगी वह भारतीय पद्धति की अर्थात् शिवाजी पद्धति की तरह होगी या वह नवीनतम पद्धति की होगी ?

श्री यशवन्त राव चव्हाण : वह शिक्षा आधुनिक पद्धति की होगी ?

श्री श्रींकार लाल बेरवा : मैं जानना चाहूंगा कि हमारे सैनिकों को गुरिल्ला युद्ध की ट्रेनिंग देने के लिए अब तक क्या प्रबन्ध किया गया है ?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: Guerilla warfare and mountain warfare are two quite different things.

Shri P. C. Borooah: May I know whether it is a fact that Yugoslavia is offering arms and ammunitions for our mountain armies and, if so, whether their supplies will be adequate for these six divisions which we propose to set up?

Shri Y. B. Chavan. I require notice for this question.

श्री यशपाल सिंह : ये लोग स्पेशल सर्विस कंडेन्संस में ही रकखे जायेंगे या इन्हें आर्ड्यूस लाइफ़ के लिए कोई खास टी०ए० या डी०ए० भी दिया जायगा ?

श्री यशवन्त राव चव्हाण : वह जब माउंटंस में ड्यूटी करेंगे तब उन को स्पेशल एलाउंस मिलेगा ।

Shri S. C. Samanta: May I know what other special qualities will be required to join this mountain division?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: No special qualities; special training would be required.

Shri Tyagi: In the recruitment to those divisions will any preference be given to those who are better acquainted with the topography of the local areas and who are fully acclimatised to the biting climate of the high altitude of the hills?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: These considerations are always kept in mind when recruitment is made, particularly when we are raising these divisions. There is nothing like particular preference for this.

Shri Kapur Singh: May I know whether the recruitment to this force will be on class basis or an simply individual quality basis?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: Individual quality basis.

Shri Hem Barua: May I know if those six divisions contemplated by Government are those six divisions spoken of by Shri Patnaik in Washington? If so, may I know whether Government propose to back up those six divisions with guerilla forces, as disclosed by Shri Patnaik in Washington?

Mr. Speaker: That is not relevant to this question.

Shri Hem Barua: We were at a loss to know whether those six divisions....

Mr. Speaker: Even if Shri Patnaik has spoken about those divisions, just at present we are not concerned with that in this question.

Shri Hem Barua: He must have spoken with some authority.

Mr. Speaker: That is a separate thing altogether. Now we are discussing the six divisions which are proposed to be set up. Shri Nath Pai.

Shri Nath Paim.

Shri Hem Barua: I wanted to know whether these six divisions....

Mr. Speaker: Order, order.

Shri Bhagwat Jha Azad: I think the hon. Member is haunted by the Patnaik ghost. (*Interruptions*).

Mr. Speaker: Order, order.

Shri Hem Barua: He says that Patnaik's ghost is in me. I do not want him to act as a conjurer to drive out that ghost.... (*Interruptions*).

Shri Bhagwat Jha Azad: Sit down.

Shri Hem Barua: Who are you to say that? (*Interruptions*).

Mr. Speaker: Order, order. I have called Shri Nath Pai. (*Interruptions*).

Shri Hem Barua: Sir, we always submit to you. You have the right to abuse and we will submit to it. But now one hon. Member has asked me to sit down. Who is he to say that?

Mr. Speaker: Order, order. I do not claim I have any right to abuse anybody.

Shri Hem Barua: I will submit to it if you do that.

Mr. Speaker: I would not do that. At the same time, I would ask other members also not to indulge in this mutual abuse. Certainly, when I call a member to order, if he submits and just resumes his seat, there might not be any occasion for any other member to step in. But when I call upon a member to order, or ask him to resume his seat, if he does not do it, then there is that provocation (*Interruptions*) Order, order. Would he kindly resume his seat and kindly listen to me? I called him to order twice or thrice. When he did not stop even then, possibly from that side there was some shouting. Therefore, I would request hon. Members just to allow me to keep or maintain order. I have confidence that I will be able to do it and Members will obey me. But when other members come to my aid, confusion is created and I am rather put into difficulties. Whereas, I expect every hon. Member to obey—I should use that word—when I ask him to do a thing, if he does not do it,

then other Members should give me some time to see whether I can manage him. They should not at once get provoked.

Shri Hem Barua: On a point of clarification.... (*Interruptions*).

Mr. Speaker: Order, order. There is nothing more now to be said. The hon. Member may sit down. Shri Nath Pai.

Shri D. N. Tiwary: In view of the fact that the Member did not listen to the Chair.....

Mr. Speaker: Order, order. I have called Mr. Nath Pai.

Shri Nath Pai: Mr. Speaker, Sir, may I ask the Defence Minister whether it is a fact that the Government of the People's Republic of Yugoslavia has offered to supply equipment specially suited for use in mountain warfare?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: I think I answered that question. I said, I require notice for that question.

Shri Swell: Sir, I have been trying to catch your eye but I have not been successful so far.

Mr. Speaker: I am sorry, there might be sometimes great uproar elsewhere and I might not have seen him. I would call him now. Furthermore, I shall get my eyes examined also in the evening!

Shri Swell: Does the Government have in mind to recruit a large number of hill people of Eastern India into these new Mountain Divisions and do they contemplate to have one complete Division consisting of the hill people of Eastern India?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: I would request the hon. Member to repeat his question.

Shri Swell: Does the Government have in mind to recruit a large number of hill people from Eastern India and do they have anything in their mind like one complete Division which shall consist of these hill people?

Shri Y. B. Chavan: That is not a feasible proposition. But certainly we are trying to take more and more people from hill areas also. To have exclusively one Division of merely hill people is not desirable also.

Employment and Guidance Bureaux in Universities

*772. **Shrimati Jyotsna Chanda:** Will the Minister of Labour and Employment be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to open Employment Assistance and Guidance Bureaux in all the Universities; and

(b) if so, when the proposal is expected to be implemented?

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Labour and Employment and for Planning (Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman): (a) and (b). The proposal at present is to set up 38 such Bureaux by the end of Third Plan. So far, Bureaux have been opened in 20 Universities.

Shrimati Jyotsna Chanda: May I know in which Universities such Bureaux have already been opened?

Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman: There are 56 Universities in all. So far, Bureaux have been opened in 20 Universities. I can give the names—it is a big list. The Bureaux that have been opened are in Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Delhi, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Mysore, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal.

Shrimati Jyotsna Chanda: May I know the financial implications that will arise from this scheme?

Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman: The financial implications are that we have a regular staff, a University professor in charge of a Bureau. We have also provided accommodation. The scheme provides for an expenditure of Rs. 10,500 per annum as recurring and Rs. 3,000 as non-recurring. So far, a

total number of 5825 graduates are on the live register in 20 Bureaux that are functioning in the country.

Shri Vasudevan Nair: May I know what are the specific functions of these bureaux and whether these will not overlap with the functions of the general employment exchange scheme?

Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman: It is for that purpose that we had a committee which has examined the whole situation. So far as University man-power is concerned, there are, what is called, specialised graduates who are registered and ordinary graduates are also registered side by side. We try to prevent the graduates registered in Universities also registering themselves in the employment exchanges and to avoid any duplication.

Shri Bhagwat Jha Azad: May I know whether there is any proposal to open similar bureaux in the so-far-left-out States as stated by the hon. Minister just now?

Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman: As I told the hon. Members, the idea is to have 38 such bureaux by the end of the Third Plan out of 56 Universities.

Shri D. C. Sharma: There are about 6000 persons on the live registers. How many of them have got any jobs?

Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman: It is a very large question.

Shrimati Savitri Nigam: May I know whether this experiment has been successful and what has been the percentage of placement?

Shri C. R. Pattabhi Raman: It has been successful so far as the specialised graduates, with special qualifications, are concerned. So far as the general run of graduates are concerned, it has not been so successful. We are studying the question.
