The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Finance (Shri B R. (a) 10-year Bhagat): Defence Certificates have been placed on sale at the Indian Missions in Britain and U.S.A. from 20th December 1962. Arrangements are also being made for their sale through the Commission for India in Hong Kong with effect from 1st March, 1963.

- (b) It is as yet too early to assess the response to the scheme.
- (c) Up to 6th February 1963, total sales amounted to Rs. 1.4 lakhs. Amount invested by foreigners is not known separately.

## University Courses in Medicine

- i) whether Government have taken any steps to shorten the Univec ty courses in Medicine to meet wie needs arising out of the National Emergency;
- whether Universities been consulted in the matter; and
  - (c) if so, what is their reaction?

The Minister of Health (Dr. Sushila Nayar): (a) to (c). The Government of India have recommended to the Universities the implementation at the revised Under-Graduate medieal curriculum adopted by the Medicol Council at its meeting held on the 27th May, 1962. According to this revised curriculum the medical course will be of 41 years' duration only. It will be followed by compusory rotating housemanship of 12 months. This is a general recommendation of the Medical Council and not a measure arising out of the national emergency. The Medical Council has representatives of Universities also on it and the measure has moreover been discussed at a meeting of the Heads of Institutions called by the Ministry of Health. The reduction of the period of the course has been effected by restricting the holidays and vacations and prescribing that the total number of full working days shall not be less than 250 days in a year. The Universities are generally likely to adopt the recommendation of the Council although formal Medical decisions are still awaited from them.
