Shri Ranga: Six lakhs have been allotted.

Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri: Rs. 6.50 lakhs for the Third Five Year Plan, for 5 years.

Shri Ranga: You have spent only Rs. 1 lakh.

Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri: How many years have passed out of the Third Five Year Plan?

Shri Ranga: This is social welfare.

Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri: May I inform the hon. Member that all the amount could not be spent immediately? There are hostels being built; then, for the supply of books, scholarships etc., have to be given. They will be given year to year. It will take sometime. We will spend all the money. He need not bother about that.

(क) और (ख). दिल्ली में स्थान की कमी के कारण भारत सरकार के कुछ कार्यालयों को दिल्ली से बाहर भेजने का प्रस्ताव है। बाहर भेज जाने वाले कार्यालयों में से केन्द्रीय हिन्दी निदेशालय का एक हिस्सा भी शामिल है। स्थान की अत्यधिक कमी होने के कारण निदेशालय का बाहर भेजा जाना अनिवार्य जान पड़ता है।

Exploration of Oil in Cauvery Basin

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have proposed to offer the Carvery basin to any foreign company to prospect for oil;

(b) if so, whether any progress has been made so far in this direction; and

(c) the basic reasons for Government to reverse their initial decision that the Cauvery basin be explored under State auspices?

The Minister of Mines and Fuel (Shri K. D. Malaviya): (a) to (c). This area was one of the areas which

were declared in May, 1960 as open for grant of licences and leases, on negotiated basis, to private parties in participation with Oil and Natural Gas Commission. No satisfactory offer from any private company has been received for this area. Meanwhile, preliminary work is being carried out by the Oil and Natural Gas Commission.
