#### STATEMENT

- (a) No separate U.N. Special Fund has been constituted specifically for the development of Asian Highways. There is, however, already an existing U.N. Special Fund intended for assisting the under-developed, countries in their economic development and out of this Fund assistance can be obtained for Asian Highways also.
- (b) Contributions to this Fund are made by the participating countries on a voluntary basis and no specific principles as such have been laid down for this purpose.
- (c) The question of approaching the U.N. Special Fund for assistance for the Asian Highway Project i. being examined by the ECAFE Secretariat in consultation with the members of the Expert Working Groups in the countries in the sub-region comprising Pakistan, Burma, India and Thailand and the matter will be processed further by the ECAFE Secretariat on receipt of the views of those experts.
- (d) The ECAFE have recommended the consideration of the use of mechanical equipment worth about \$1 million for expediting the development of the priority Route A-1 in India between Silchar and Imphal.

### Tawa Project

\*828. Shrl Hari Vishnu Kamath: Will the Minister of Irrigation and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the stage which the multipurpose Tawa Project (Hoshangabad district, Madhya Pradesh) has reached; and
- (b) when it is expected to be commissioned?

The Minister of State in the Ministry of Irrigation and Power (Shri Alagesan): (a). The project is in its preliminary stage of construction. Exploratory borings for the dam and the submersible bridge have been completed. Work on approach roads and buildings at dam site is in progress.

(b) The project is expected to be commissioned by 1968.

The Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Food (Shri A. M. Thomas):

(a) to (c). The Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow has suggested the use of Ratanjot root dye for colouring Vanaspati. Studies are still in progress to find its toxicity and to determine whether it is safe for human consumption. The cost of colouring Vanaspati with this substance has been estimated by that Institute to be about 0.6 nP per pound, that is Rs. 13.35 per tonne.
