the plebiscite is not held the position reverts to the pre-cease-fire conditions and, if so, whether Government have examined the validity of this argument?

Shri Krishna Menon: He has made many statements of this kind. But we cannot wage war on statement. any action follows we will meet them with reason and discretion.

Shri P. K. Deo: May I know if the landing of the American forces in Thailand has further complicated the explosive situation in Laos or has it been able to stabilise matters?

Shri Dinesh Singh: That is entirely a different matter-the landing of American forces.

Mr. Speaker: It is a matter of opinion also.

Shri Hari Vishnu Kamath: Is there any truth in press reports to the effect that the Chairman of the Control Commission, Mr. Parthasarathy, believe, has found evidence or proof of aggressive and subversive activities of North Viet Nam in the Southern States and if so what is Government's reaction thereto?

Shri Dinesh Singh: It is entirely a different question.

Shri Hari Vishnu Kamath: I said Southern States.

Mr. Speaker: The Question Hour is over.
