

Shri V. P. Nayar: These happen to be communication centres for diseases. We are very much concerned.

Mr. Speaker: I agree.

Shri V. P. Nayar: May I know whether there is any moving personnel to check up the food served by the Railway catering service in the moving trains? What is the periodicity for that inspection?

Shri Shahnawaz Khan: There are competent railway officers and inspectors whose job it is to go and check.

Shri V. P. Nayar: But they do not know anything about food.

Mr. Speaker: Very well. Individual cases should be brought to notice.

Electric Trains

*852. **Shri Jadhav:** Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

(a) when the work of having electric trains on the Manmad Bhusawal route on Central Railway is to be taken up; and

(b) from what resources the electric power will be used for the above purposes?

The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) Survey and Civil Engineering Works will be started during 1958-59.

(b) Electric Power for this section will be available from Railways Power House at Kalyan and from the proposed Power House of the Bombay State Electricity Board at Bhusawal.

Shri Jadhav: May I know what amount has been sanctioned for this work?

Shri Shahnawaz Khan: I shall require notice for that, to give the specific amount.

Mr. Speaker: It must have been in the Budget.

Shri Shahnawaz Khan: He can see that.

Shri Kamalnayan Bajaj: I would like to know how many years it would take to complete the work taken in hand, and what is the economy that is likely to be effected per mile on moving train, and how much time it is likely to save.

Mr. Speaker: How many questions? The hon. Minister may confine himself to one question.

Shri Kamalnayan Bajaj: How many years is it likely to take to complete?

Shri Shahnawaz Khan: It will take at least three to four years.

Flying Instructors

*853. **Shri Ram Krishan:** Will the Minister of Transport and Communications be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that due to shortage of Flying Instructors at the Civil Aviation Training Centre, Bamrauli, the pilots are not being trained properly; and

(b) if so, what action Government propose to take in this matter?

The Minister of State in the Ministry of Transport and Communications (Shri Humayun Kabir): (a) & (b). There has been some temporary shortage of Flying Instructors at the Civil Aviation Training Centre, Bamrauli, but this has not interfered with the proper training of the pilots. Action has recently been taken for filling up the vacant post of Junior Flying Instructor. In addition, Government is examining the recommendation for a further increase in the number of Flying Instructors made by the Committee appointed to review training facilities for Civil Air Pilots.

Shri Ram Krishan: May I know the total number of additional flying instructors to be employed?

Shri Humayun Kabir: As I have said, the matter is under examination, but the recommendation of the committee is for one more flying instructor.
