The Minister of State in the Ministry of Transport and Communications (Shri Raj Bahadar): (a) and (b) Garubasha-Hatisar Road.—Construction work has been undertaken in the first 15 miles. 71 per cent formation work and 6 culverts were completed upto June 1959, with an expenditure of Rs. 8-25 lakes.

Jainti-Buxaduar-Sanchula Road.— Survey work has been completed on 9 miles from Jainti to Buxaduar. Earth work on the first mile from Jainti is in hand. An expenditure of Rs 47,100 has been reported so far.
