English Advertisements in Hindi Dailies

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Directorate of Advertising and Visual Publicity of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has asked the Hindi daily papers to publish the Union Public Service Commission advertisements in English; and
 - (b) if so, the reasons therefor?

The Minister of Information and Broadcasting (Dr. Keskar): (a) and (b). The Hindi daily papers have not been asked to publish Union Public Service Commission advertisements in English but following a suggestion of the Chairman, Union Public Service Commission, an enquiry was made from them as well as other Indian language papers being used for Union

Public Service Commission advertisements, if they could publish these advertisements in English for the reasons that: (i) it would ensure the accuracy of the text and (ii) it would enable the use of Indian language papers with higher circulation than English newspapers in certain centres for the purpose of English advertisements also.

International Trade Fair

Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there has been any increase in the demand for Indian goods in Czechoslovakia as a result of India's participation in the International Trade Fair held in that country in September, 1959; and
- (b) if so, the main Indian goods which are in demand in Czechoslovakia?

The Deputy Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Satish Chandra):
(a) India participated in the Fair in a symbolic manner mainly for creating good will and utilising the opportunity for demonstrating India's growing industrial potential.

(b) The main items of export to Czechoslovakia are iron ores, hides and skins, mica, manganese ore, spices, tea and industrial glycerine.

Consumption of Suiphur

Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) what is the total annual consumption of sulphur in the country at present;

- (b) how much of it is produced in our country and from which sources;
- (c) whether any attempt has been made to produce on a commercial scale sulphur which is abundantly found in sulphides of various metals in our country; and
 - (d) if so, since when?

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) to (d):

The annual consumption of sulphur in the country at present is estimated to be about 1,10,000 tons to 1,20,000 tons.

In view of the demands for sulphur being entirely met by imports, a study has been undertaken regarding the possibility of producing this element from pyrites ores. Based on the report submitted by the Indian Bureau of Mines indicating that sufficient reserves of pyrites have since been proved at Amjor in the District of Sahabad, Bihar State, it has since been decided to undertake the manufacture of sulphur from pyrites. In this connection a preliminary assessment was made of the economics of a process developed by a Norwegian firm, for producing sulphur from pyrites. An expert from the Norwegian firm has visited the sites of the deposits in the country, to work out a detailed report on the mining and winning of the ores, and broad estimates for the project for the manufacture of sulphur. The report is still awaited.

Code of Discipline

- (a) whether some of the industries in public sector have not yet implemented the Code of Discipline;
- (b) if so, the reasons for the same; and

The Ministry of Railways consider that as the main objectives of the Code have already been secured through their long established procedures and conventions, it is not necessary for them to adopt the Code. The question of the adoption of the Code by other public sector undertakings is being pursued.
