The Minister of Information and Broadcasting (Dr. Keskar): (a) and (b). Yes, Sir. Two biographies, on Dadabhai Naoroji and C. R. Das, have already been released.

Sale of Hyderabad House in New Delhi

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Andhra Pradesh Government is going to sell away the Hyderabad House in New Delhi; and
 - (b) if so, the details of the deal?

The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda): (a) Yes Sir; the Andhra Pradesh Government have offered for sale to the Government of India the Hyderabad House in New Delhi.

(b) The terms of purchase are still under negotiation with State Government. The value of the property is being assessed by the Technical Officers of the Central and Andhra Pradesh State Governments.

Atomic Test in the Sahara

Will the **Prime Minister** be pleased to state whether it is a fact that twenty-five nations of the Afro-Asian group, including India have formally protested to the U.N. against the decision of France to explode an atomic device in the Sahara in the face of the General Assembly's resolution recommending that it refrain from such actions?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri Sadath Ali Khan): Twenty-five countries of the Asian-African group, including India addressed a letter to the Secretary-General of the United Nations on 2nd February 1980, expressing the deep concern of their governments at the impending nuclear tests proposed by France in the Sahara.
