Will the Minister of Education be pleased to refer to the reply given to Unstarred Question No. 2278 on the 19th April, 1960 and state:

(a) whether the Working Group appointed by the Union Ministry of Education to study the education problem in Delhi has submitted its report; and

(b) if so, the main recommendations contained therein?

The Minister of Education (Dr. K. L. Shrimali): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) A statement is laid on the Table of the Sabha.

STATEMENT

(b). The main findings of the Working Group are:

(1) By the beginning of the fourth quinquennium i.e. 1976-81, the population of Delhi might be about 35.7 lakhs and on an average of 200 students per school, 1712 additional single-section primary schools would be needed to cater for the increase in the population of the age group of 6-11 years. These schools would have to be manned by 8,560 teachers. Similarly, 652 middle schools with 5,868 teachers would be required for middle school education, each school catering for 250 students. At the higher secondary level, 532 additional schools would be needed with 4,740 teachers, each school catering for 200 students with double sections.

(2) In the field of higher education, assuming that the average size of a college would be about 1,250 students, it will require something like 32 additional colleges. In terms of space, this may mean, on a conservative estimate, 10 acres of land per college and a total of 320 acres would have to be provided in the course of the next 20 years for college campuses alone. In addition, it would be necessary to provide for playgrounds, etc., on a suitable basis.
