Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the U.K. Government has decided to participate in the Outer Seven Scheme of the European Countries; and
- (b) if so, what are the safeguards for Indian goods and details of the safeguards?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kanungo): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) In giving our consent to the United Kingdom's request for justment of their commitments regarding tariff preference to Indian products, we had attached certain conditions which we considered necessary to safeguard 'India's essential commercial interests. In particular we stressed that the elemination of the contractual preferences not involve the levy of duty on Indian goods at a rate higher than at present applicable, and also that Indian goods are not placed at a disadvantage in relation to goods from European Free Trade Area.

The effects of India's exports to the United Kingdom will be kept under constant review, and we have kept ourselves free to take up the question of compensation at a later stage, if any actual damage is caused.

Training-cum-Production Centre for Artistic Handicrafts

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) and (b). On the recommendation of a French Expert, the Indian Handicrafts Development Corporation Lt. have decided to set up a training-cum-production centre for artistic handbags in Delhi. The Centre will start functioning as soon as preliminary arrangements, such as the import of requisite machinery, etc. have been completed.
