Import of Automobile Tyres by State Trading Corporation

*792. Shri Vidya Charan Shukla:
Will the Minister of Commerce and
Industry be pleased to refer to the
reply given to Unstarred Question
No. 1097 on the 14th March, 1960 and
state:

- (a) the particulars of the source from where the automobile tyres were imported by the State Trading Corporation;
- (b) how many of these tyres have been purchased by the actual users;
- (c) whether any complaints have been received regarding these tyres; and
- (d) if so, the nature of the complaints received?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kanungo): (a) Import of tyres has been arranged by the STC from China, Czechoslovakia and USSR. Some quantities are going to be imported from Poland, Italy and Japan.

- (b) Nearly 10,000 tyres have been supplied to Actual Users.
- (c) Yes, Sir. Complaints have been received from some parties with regard to the performance of the tyres of Chinese origin supplied to them.
- (d) The Actual Users have complained that the tyres burst without giving adequate mileage.

Tibetan Refugees

*793. Shri Raghunath Singh: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state whether it is a fact that Tibetan refugees have been employed to work on Kargil-leh Road in Ladakh? The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri Sadath Ali Khan): Yes, Sir. About 700 Tibetan refugees are employed on the Kargil-Leh Road.

Disarmament

*794. Shri Harish Chandra Mathur:
Shri Kalika Singh:

Will the **Prime Minister** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have received any communication from the Prime Minister of the U.S.S.R. regarding 'Disarmament' after the failure of the Summit meeting;
- (b) if so, what is Government's reaction thereto; and
- (c) whether it has been conveyed to the U.S.S.R. Government?

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shrimati Lakshmi Menon):
(a) Yes, Sir. After the failure of

- the Summit meeting, the Government received a communication from the Prime Minister of the U.S.S.R., together with the text of the Soviet proposals on disarmament.
- (b) Government regard the proposals generally as being a constructive and helpful approach to the problem of disarmament.
- (c) No formal communication has been sent, but the Prime Minister expressed Government's broad appreciations of this approach to disarmament at a press conference.

Indian Merchants in Tibet

*795. Dr. Ram Subhag Singh: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Indian merchants whose stocks are locked up in their trade establishments in Tibet;
- (b) the approximate value of their stock and immovable properties owned by them in Tibet; and
