

**Production at Sindri Fertilizers**

\*708. **Shri Tangamani:** Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether the production in the Sindri fertilisers has been kept up to schedule;

(b) what is the production during July, August and September, 1960 compared to corresponding period of the last year; and

(c) what is the estimated production during the year 1960?

**The Deputy Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Satish Chandra):**

(a). There has been a drop in production.

**STATEMENT**

The production during July—September, 1960 of Ammonium Sulphate, Urea and Double Salt was 71,027, 2265 and 7574 metric tons respectively against 73,730, 1106 and 9645 metric tons during the corresponding period last year.

**Export Target of Tea**

Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether the export target for tea has been worked out for the year 1960; and

(b) what steps are being taken to prevent decrease in the sale of tea in the London market?

**The Deputy Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Satish Chandra):**

(a). According to estimates prepared sometime ago, exports were expected to reach 480 million lbs. during 1960-61.

(b) An officer has been appointed in London to look after the promotion of Indian tea in the U.K., Ireland and the Scandinavian countries. An Export Promotion Committee has been set up in the Tea Board to watch the progress of tea exports. The Committee is assisted by a special panel for the U.K.
