## Length of Films

- (a) whether it is a fact that a proposal to reduce the length of Indian films to about 10,000 feet is under the consideration of the Government of India:

- (d) whether the State Governments and the film industry have been consulted in this matter: and
- (c) if so, brief details of their reactions?

The Minister of Commerce Kanungo): (a) to (e). In view of the foreign exchange position, after discussion with representatives of the Government of India the Film Federation of India agreed to a voluntary cut in the length of films as follows:-

Bombay (Hindi, Gujarati, Marathi etc.) 13.000 ft.

Madras (South Indian languages) 15,000 ft.

Calcutta (Bengali Assamese, Oriva) 12,000 ft.

The cut in the length of the films will reduce import of raw stock and save foreign exchange. The Governments were not consulted.
