The Deputy Minister of Labour (Shri Abid Ali): (a) and (b). The discussions in the Conference were confined to the situation created by the recent strike by a section of the Central Government employees. The general consensus of opinion in the Conference was in line with the purpose which Government had in view to render such strikes superfluous.

Chilka Canal

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) No, Sir.

Indians in Congo

- (a) whether it is a fact that several Asians including Indians have left Congo due to disturbed conditions there;
- (b) if so, what is the total number of such Indians who have left Congo; and
- (c) what steps have been taken by Government to recover properties left behind by such Indians?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri Sadath Ali Khan): (a) and (b). As far as the Government of India are aware, some women and children, about twenty-two in all, left the Congo and came to India. It is understood that they intend to return to the Congo in due course.

(c) None as no report of any Indian leaving properties in the Congo has been received by the Government of India
