The Minister of Industry Manubhai Shab): (a) to (c). A statement is laid on the Table of the Lok Sabha.

## Statement

No cars have been imported for the use of the Ministers of the Central or State Governments during vears 1959 and 1960.

In order to provide facilities for tourists, 60 Plymouth cars in conditions were allowed to be imported. Also in order to meet the small requirements of the Raj Bhavans State Governments who needed these cars and for the use of foreign dignitaries visiting India, M/s. Premier Automobiles Ltd., Bombay were granted an ad hoc licence in December 1959 for a c.i.f. value of Rs. 3:60 lakhs to import 36 Nos. of Plymouth cars in c.k.d. condition. The number of cars released to the different Raj Bhavans|State Governments for the purpose so far is as follows:-

## Small Scale Industries

- (a) whether it is a fact that foreign aid for small-scale industries expected from certain countries:
  - (b) if so, which are these countries;
- (c) whether it is a fact that certain countries have agreed to the diversion of a part of their aid for the purposes of small-scale industries; and
  - (d) if so, which are these countries?

The Minister of Industry Manubhai Shah): (a) to (d). A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

The Government of India are receiving assistance from the Technical Cooperation Mission, U.S.A., the Government of the Federal Republic of Government Germany and the Japan for the Proto type Productioncum-Training Centres for small scale industries at Rajkot, Delhi and Howrah respectively. An offer has been Government received from the France for a similar Centre at Guindy. Madras. A few other foreign governments have also envinced interest providing assistance for such schemes and negotiations are still in a preliminary stage. These are cases of direct assistance and the question of diversion of aid does not arise.

A.D.L.F. loan from U.S. for \$10 million has been approved for NSIC for hire-purchase of machinery for small scale industries.
