Expenditure by Government Departments

(a) whether any relaxation has been introduced regarding expenditure to be incurred by different Government departments; and

The Deputy Minister of Finance (Shrimati Tarkeshwari Sinha): (a) and (b). A scheme for re-organising the present system of financial control is under consideration, which will be tried as an experimental measure in the Ministries of Commerce and Industry, Information and Broadcasting and Community Development and Cooperation and in the Department of Food. Mainly, it involves the devolution of more financial powers to administrative Ministries and by them to their Attached and Subordinate Office. The control of the Ministry of Finance would be exercised mainly through pre-budget scrutiny and reports reeived by them from Ministries, etc., through random checks and work studies.

Fertilizer Plant, Neyveli

Rourkela Steel Plant

(a) whether it is a fact that Hin dustan Steel Limited has entrusted the operation and maintenance of the hot strip and cold rolling mills of Rourkela to a 19-member world body of experts from America;

(b) the reasons for the same; and

(c) the terms of the contract?

The Minister of Steel, Mines and Fuel (Sardar Swaran Singh: (a) to (c). Yes, Sir, Hindustan Steel have entered into a contract with the American Consulting Corporation for providing 19 experts for a period of two years for the operation of the hot strip and cold rolling mills of the Rourkela Steel Works, on payment of Rs. 6.2 million. This was done because operating personnel with sufficient experience were not available either in India or in West Germany. The American firm who are specialists in the
