The Deputy Minister of Civil Aviation (Shri Mohiuddin): (a) Rs. 117.41 lakhs.

(b) Contrary to earlier anticipations, the financial results for the current year may show at best a break-even position or even a small operating loss.

(c) The main advantages to Air India and other partners accruing from the Tripartite Partnership arrangements are elimination of wasteful competition, increased effective selling by co-operative effort of the three partners in order to secure a larger share of the market and

better and more effective distribution of the resources of each partner to provide a greater choice of services and routings to the travelling public.

The Deputy Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri A. M. Thomas):

(a) The cut of 10 per cent has been prescribed mainly having regard to the present stocks of sugar in the country and our requirements for internal consumption and exports.

(b) Surplus cane in an area, if any, may have to be converted into gur or khandsari.

Cholera in Bihar

Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government of India are aware of the fact that Cholera and other epidemic diseases have broken out in the flood-ravaged areas of Bihar State and the health of the people of the flood-affected areas is in great jeopardy;

(b) whether the Government of India are considering it desirable to rush medicines and medical supplies to the affected areas and also give other assistance to the State Government in solution of the difficult problems; and

(c) if so, the details thereof?

The Minister of Health (Shri Kar-markar): (a) Stray cases of diarrhoea and vomiting were reported from the flood-affected areas of the State. No disease in an epidemic form is reported to have broken out in those areas.

(b) and (c). No request has been received by the Central Government from the Government of Bihar for supply of medicines. One hundred short tons of skimmed milk powder received by the Government of India from the T.C.M. authorities have, however, been allocated to the Government of Bihar for supply to the vulnerable section among flood sufferers through Government agencies.

(a) whether any fresh negotiations between U.S. Government authorities and the Government have been made for allotment of further quota of sugar to be exported to America;

(b) whether allotment of permanent quota is under consideration; and

(c) whether any deviation is suggested from the terms and conditions of previous agreements?

The Deputy Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri A. M. Thomas):

(a) and (b). Yes, the matter is under discussion with the U.S. Government.

(c) Quotas are allocated under the U.S. Sugar Act while sale transactions are canalised through normal trade channels. The question of a formal agreement with the U.S. Government does not arise.
