Subsidiary Dam at Chiplima of Hirakud Dam Project

*468. Shri Supakar: Will the Minister of Irrigation and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) the up-to-date progress in the construction of a subsidiary dam at Chiplima of the Hirakud Dam Project; and
- (b) the date by which power will be available from the subsidiary dam?

Financial Aid to Andhra

Food Situation in Tripura

- *471. Shri Bangshi Thakur: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government are aware of the fact that the quota of rice at fair price shops in Tripura has at present been reduced to 2½ seers per-head instead of 3½ seers allowed previously and the price has been fixed at the rate of Rs. 18 at present instead of Rs. 15 previously per maund; and
- (b) if so, whether Government propose to increase the quota to 3½ seers per head per week and reduce the price to Rs. 15 per maund as before?

The Deputy Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri A. M. Thomas):
(a) and (b). There has not been any recent decrease in the quantum of rice sold to each individual through fair price shops in Tripura. The scale is 12 ozs per adult per day and is continuing since September, 1956.

The normal issue price of rice from fair price shops in Tripura was Rs. 17/8/- per maund. This was temporarily reduced to Rs. 15/- per maund after the floods last year. It has been recently raised to Rs. 18/-per maund which is considered reasonable keeping in view the prices prevailing in Tripura and in the adjoining areas of East Pakistan
