Title: Regarding plastic waste management.

SHRI RITESH PANDEY (AMBEDKAR NAGAR): According to the Central Pollution Control Board, India generates 26,000 tonnes of plastic waste every day. Plastic bans haven't worked because of lax implementation, and the government's target of phasing out single-use plastic by 2022 seems to be a mirage.
