Title: Regarding establishment and implementation of Dual Time Zones in India.

SHRI PRADYUT BORDOLOI (NAWGONG): Sir, Assam and the North-East became a part ( British India very late. But when the Britishers came to Assam, they introduced a local time Assam, so that the administration could utilize and optimize efficiency and productivity industrial activities. In the aftermath of Independence, the IST has been imposed, and we are bac to square one. The reason why I am telling you this is that in the eastern place of Arunach Pradesh, there is a place called Jairampur and Vijaynagar, and from there to Jaisalmer and Gujara there is a difference of 30 degree longitude. That means that the time difference is almost tw hours. When we have a single time zone, the people of the North-East are being discriminate because we lose precious day time hours and hence productivity. It creates a lot of problems. Aft Independence, with the imposition of IST, Assam became a land of lahe lahe, that means Assa became very slow. We want to optimize the productivity and efficiency, and that is why, w should have different time zones. You will agree with me that different nations across the wor have different time zones. Bigger nations like USA have got 11 time zones; France has got 1 time zones. Why can we not have a separate time zone for the North-East to optimize and utiliz the productivity of our people? That is my concern and that is my request to the Government ( India.
