STATEMENT REFERRED IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION No. \*76 ASKED BY SHRI SAUMITRA KHAN, MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT, FOR REPLY ON 21.07.2022 REGARDING "MINORITY STATUS TO COMMUNITIES"

- (a) & (b): The Central Government has notified six communities namely Christians, Sikhs, Muslims, Buddhists, Jains and Parsis as Minority communities under Section 2 (c) of the National Commission for Minorities (NCM) Act, 1992.
- (c) to (e): The total population of India increased from 102,86,10,328 as per Census 2001, to 121,08,54,977 as per Census 2011. The population of minorities in the country increased from 19,37,29,246 (18.83%) as per Census 2001 to 23,38,49,851 (19.31%) as per Census 2011, whereas in West Bengal, the population of Minorities increased from 2,11,20,996 (26.34% of total population of West Bengal) as per Census 2001 to 2,57,20,296 (28.17% of total population of West Bengal) as per Census 2011. At present, there is no such proposal under consideration in the Ministry.
