Anti-malaria Operations are carried-out in Delhi State under the direct control of the Director. Malaria Institute of India, Delhi. Such measures in the Coalfields Coorg State are carried his technical control. The operations have been very successful and have reduced the incidence of Malaria in some of these areas to negligible proportions.

(c) Research in the various aspects of malaria control is one of the main functions of the Malaria Institute of India. The work done at the Institute has established that with the use of residual insecticides like D.D.T. B.H.C. and the synthetic anti-malarial remedies, it is possible to reduce malaria incidence in the country to a level where it will cease to interfere with the social and economic life of the country.
