(b) Is it a fact that orders are being placed on the I.S.D., London for articles which could easily be manufactured in the Indian Ordnance Factories?

The Deputy Minister of Defence (Shri Satish Chandra): (a) The India Store Department, London is controlled by the Ministry of Works, Housing and Supply which examines its work.

(b) Normally orders are placed on the I.S.D., London, only for those articles which cannot be procured or manufactured in India. There may, however, be some cases in which the stores capable of being manufactured in the Ordnance Factories are ordered because the requirements of such items may be so small that it would be highly un-economical to manufacture them in this country. Such thems are, therefore, obtained from U.K. through I.S.D., London

Sardar A. S. Saigal: May I know whether the I.S.D., report has pointed out that the Ministry of Defence is placing orders for articles which are available or which could be manufactured in India?

Shri Satish Chandra: The pres-cribed procedure when placing an order is to send indents simultane-ously to the Director General of Supplies and Disposals, to the Develop-ment Wing in the Commerce and In-dustry Ministry and to our Director General of Ordnance Factories. All of them examine whether this parti-cular store could be manufactured or could be procured in the country. If indigenous sources are discovered. the indent on the India Store Department is immediately cancelled.

Sardar A. S. Saigal: May I know whether it is a fact that the I.S.D. report on page 17, para 11 says that it these stores are purchased in India, the cost will be cheaper?

Deputy-Speaker: That is Mr. clear.

The Deputy Minister of Works Housing and Supply (Shri Burago-hain): May I answer this question, Sir, on behalf of my colleague the Deputy-Minister of Defence? It is true that the Regional Committee for the London organization has converted the London organisation has reported that a large number of contracts placed by them are for small items. That is the 'problem 'hat has been pointed out by them and that is under

examination by the Ministry Works, Housing and Supply in consultation with the Ministry of Defence and also the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. They have pointed out that thirty per cent of the contracts are for the value of £30 and less and prother 20 per of £30 and less and prother 20 per of £30 and less and another 20 per cent. are of the value between £30 and £100. So, roughly about 50 per cent. are for stores of the value of £100 or less.

Shri G. P. Sinha: In view of the fact that we are maintaining surplus labour in the Ordnance factories, the ultimate cost of production will be cheaper here because we have to pay the labourers whether we manufacture things or not.

Shri Satish Chandra: The position as stated by the hon. Member is not quite correct. Our Ordnance factories have got about 50,000 workers. According to present work load there may be a surplus of about 3,000 workers short'y. By manufacturing additional items, we propose to utilize the control of the control o lise the services of all these labours.

At present they are not surplus.

They will be surplus in a month or two. We are planning for future months.

Shri Nanadas: What are the main items of articles which are not produced in India, but which are imported from the U.K.?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: How can all of them be given here, Hundreds of them are there. The hon. Member may kindly put down a question and elicit answer. Next question.

भी बे॰ के॰ भॉसके; सब क़ै साथ साहोताहै। लाला अधित राम: क्या घाप को इस बात का इस्म है कि ऐसे बहुत से विद्यार्थी हैं जो कि घपना ट्रेनिंग का पीरियड खत्म करते हैं, लेकिन उनको इतनी महारत हासिल नहीं होती कि वे घपना काम चानू कर सकें ? क्या घापको इसकी इसला है ?

पुर्नवास मनी (श्री ए० पी० जंन): सब तरह के विद्यार्थी होते हैं। कुछ सील जाते हैं, कुछ रद्दी होते हैं जो नहीं सील पाते भीर छोड़कर चले जाते हैं।
