WRITTEN ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

INDIAN MILITARY MISSION IN NEPAL

\*1319. Shri Raghunath Singh: (a) Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the Working Committee of the Nepalese Congress have demanded the withdrawal of the Indian Military Mission which has been in Kathmandu at the request of the Government of Nepal?

(b) If so, do Government contemplate to withdraw the said Mission?

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shri Anil K, Chanda): (a) Government have seen press reports about this.

(b) No. The mission was sent in April 1952 at the request of the Government of Nepal and, according to all accounts, has done which has been greatly appreciated by the Government of Nepal.

## **BISCUITS**

\*1323. Shri Buchhikotaiah: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state what is the total annual productive capacity of the bisculf factories in India?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari): The annual installed capacity of organised factories is estimated at about 40,000 tons.

RELAY OF BANNED CINEMA SONGS

\*1335. Shri Balwant Sinha Mehta:
(a) Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state whether it is a fact that cinema songs which are banned here, are relayed from other foreign countries and especially from Ceylon?

(b) If so, what steps are taken to check this practice?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): (a) There are no relays from foreign countries, but it has been noticed that in the broadcasts of Ceylon, Goa and Pakistan Radios, there are sometimes film songs not included in or excluded from All andia Radio's programme.

(b) The Government of India are not in a position to guggest to Radio organizations of other countries what types of broadcasting material should be used in their programmes.

## IRON-ORE EXPORT TO JAPAN

\*1336. Shri C. R. Narasimban: (a) Will the Minister of Commerce and

Industry be pleased to state whether Government have renewed negotiation with Japan for the export of Indian Iron-ore to that country?

- (b) If so, what is the export quota fixed?
- (c) Will there be a State-wise distribution of the export quota?
- (d) Has the proposal of magnificiation and briquetting of the vastly available magnetite ores of Salem been brought to the notice of Government in this connection?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): (a) No, Sir.

BURMA EVACUEES

\*1339. { Shri Rajagopala Rao: Shri K. Subrahmanyam:

Will the **Prime Minister** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government of India have received any report from the Government of Madras about the steps taken by that Government to ameliorate the condition of Burma evacuees settled in Vizagapatnam and Srikakulam Districts; and
- (b) if not, whether Government have made any enquiry into the steps taken by the Madras Government in this direction?

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shri Anil K. Chanda): (a) and (b). Yes; a recent report states that most of the evacuees have now settled down in their villages. Many are earning their livelihood by seasonal agricultural labour, and some of those in coastal villages by fishing Skilled workers are returning to Burma, and many of the ex-Burma Railway employees have been absorbed by the Indian Railways. Spinning and weaving co-operative societies have been established, and financial assistance and capital advances have been given to them to facilitate their rehabilitation.
