[Maulana Azad: How can I give their names at this stage? The application shall be considered only when any new university comes into being, and asks for grant from the Government.]

Kumari Annie Mascarene: May I know, Sir. the names of the Universities to which these advances are given and whether any South Indian University is included in the list?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: I would like to inform the Members of the House that we have got 26 Universities that are receiving help. It is a long list.

Kumari Annie Mascarene: What is the answer to the second part of the question?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: I am not going to allow that question. I have already said that such questions on territorial basis will not be allowed.—South India, North India—east, west. So far as the list of Universities is concerned, there are as many as 26 Universities. I am not going to allow the time of the House to be taken up by reading the names of all the Universities.

Shri Sarangadhar Das: May I know whether any subsidy has been granted to the Utkal University?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: I am not going to allow that question.

Shri Sarangadhar Das: It is not territorial.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: The hon. Minister has placed the statement of subsidy on the Table of the House.

Shri V. P. Nayar: In granting these subsidies to the Universities, have the Government of India given a direction as to the subject on which research has to be done or whether the Universities have full freedom to do it?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: Yes, Sir. In several cases specific demands are made by the Universities and on that basis also grants are given.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS

*1219. Prof. D. C. Sharma: (a) Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state the number of public schools under the Central Government?

(b) Where are they located?

The Deputy Minister of Natural Resources and Scientific Research (Shrit K. D. Malaviya): (a) Nil.

(b) Does not arise.

Prof. D. C. Sharma: May I know if the Government of India give any grants to the various public schools and if so, what is the administrative set up *vis-a-vis* the Ministry?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: These public schools which have been given some grants by the Government of India are administratively divorced from the Ministry, because from the experience gained in running these schools, it was decided that they should be autonomous schools. They are now administered by autonomous bodies and they receive ad hoc grants from us.

Shri V. P. Nayar: How do the tuition fees of the public schools compare with those of the ordinary schools, and if it is on the increase, what is the percentage of it?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: Fairly high.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: From the number of public schools, you are going to the fees. The hon. Minister has answered, fairly high. Now, you want. what percentage. Does it arise out of this question?

Shri N. M. Lingam: May I know whether the public schools at Lovedale and Sanawar are not under the Central Government?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: No. Sir. They are not under the Central Government.

Shri Dabhi: May I know whether English is the medium of instruction in all these schools and if so, the reason therefor?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: Yes.

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Shrimati Renu Chakravartty: What is the total amount of grant which has been given to these schools for this year?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: They are under the Central Government

Shri Boovaraghasamy: What is the educational curriculum in these schools?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: The hon. Member wants the curriculum—the syllabus.

Shri N. M. Lingam: What are the steps being taken to see that these schools are not exclusively foreign, and that the training imparted is in conformity with the Indian culture and the general pattern of education in the country?

[Maulana Azad: Since the two schools at Sanawar and Nilgiri have functioned under the control of the Government of India for some time, full efforts have been made to have the education imparted there according to the new method. And the Government can say nothing with regard to other schools which are private institutions.]

Shrimati A. Kale: May I know whether Hindi is taught as second languge in these schools?

Shri K. D. Malaviya: It is taught, so far as I know.

Shri T. S. A. Chettiar: Minister said that a certain amount is set apart for public schools and where applications are received, the amount is given.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: No. no. All that the hon. Minister said was that with respect to these schools, on an ad hoc basis, grants are given. No separate fund is set apart.

Shri T. S. A. Chettiar: May I know how they distinguish public schools, from the other schools in the country?
