The Deputy Minister of Rehabilitation (Shri J. K. Bhonsle): (a) to (d). There is a plan to construct 1,630 shops and not huts for displaced persons in Uttar Pradesh at an estimated expenditure of Rs. 25:00 lakhs. A statement is laid on the Table of the House showing the places where these shops

will be constructed. [See Appendix III, annexure No. 16.]

55 shops are proposed for Banaras. These shops will be constructed from the funds advanced by the Government of India to the State Government as a loan.

DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

*538. Dr. Amin: (a) Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state the number of meetings held by each of the Development Councils constituted under the Industries (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act, 1953 and the important questions discussed at these meetings?

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

*539. Shri Jhunjhunwala: (a) Will the Minister of Planning be pleased to state how much of the total amount spent till now on Community Projects has been spent on importing foreign consumer goods and technicians?

(b) How much has been spent towards administrative expenses?

The Deputy Minister of Irrigation and Power (Shri Hathi): (a) Consumer goods are not imported under Community Projects Programme. A sum of Rs. 786-13-0 has been spent on foreign technicians upto 31st March, 1953.

(b) Rs. 45 76 lakhs upto 30th June, 1953.

ALL-INDIA KHADI AND VILLAGE INDUS-TRIES BOARD

- *546. Shri Bhagwat Jha: (a) Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state whether the All-India Khadi and Village Industries Board has prepared any budget for the development of Khadi and village industries to be undertaken in 1954-55?
- (b) Has the proposal for organising a grand khadi and village industry exhibition in Delhi in the coming months been considered?
- (c) Are the recommendations of the Common Production Programme Committee regarding match and oil industries being examined by Government?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari):
(a) Yes, Sir. But it has not been finalised.

- (b) It is under consideration.
- (c) No, Sir.

VISAKHAPATNAM SHIPYARD

*541. Shri K. Subrahmanyam: (a) Will the Minister of Production be pleased to state whether Government are aware that keeping out workman in nil-allocation is still continuing in the Visakhapatnam Shipyard even after retrenchment?

- (b) If so, what are the reasons?.
- (c) What has happened to the proposal for getting ships for repairs from Navy and Mercantile marine?
- (d) What are the man-hours lost due to lack of work?

The Minister of Production (Shri K. C. Reddy): (a) Yes.

(b) The actual number of surplus workers at the time of the retrenchment was about 1,300 workers, but only 800 of these were retrenched after taking into consideration the future requirements of the Yard. By the beginning of the next year, it is expected that there will be no workers on nil-allocation.

- (c) A vessel belonging to the Indian Navy is undergoing repairs in the Shipyard.
- (d) The number of man-hours lost during October, 1953 on account of keeping on an average 280 men per day on nil-allocation was 53,808 manhours.

TAPIOCA STARCH

- *542. Kumari Annie Mascarene: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:
- (a) the price per ton of TapiocaStarch in Bombay;
- (b) the price at which it is purchased from the producers; and
- (c) the total quantity of starch required by the country?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari):

- (a) There is no control over the prices of Starch. The present price of Tapioca Starch is about Rs. 960/- per ton in Bombay.
- (b) The price at which Tapioca Starch is sold by producers is not available. The price of Tapioca itself, however, does not exceed Rs. 105/-per ton when sold by producers and Rs. 303/- per ton when sold in dried chips.
- (c) The country's annual requirement of starch of all kinds has been estimated at 50,000/55,000 tons.
