been taken on some of the recommendations; others are under consideration of Government and it is expected that final orders would be passed in about a month's time.

SENIORITY LISTS OF RAILWAY EMPLOYEES

*56. Shri B. Y. Reddi: (a) Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state whether the finalisation of the combined seniority lists of the various categories of staff on the regrouped Railways has since been concluded?

(b) If not, what are the reasons for the delay?

The Deputy Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri Alagesan): (a) and (b). The question which is a very complicated one has almost been finalised after the necessary consultation with Railway labour has been made.

AID FOR INDIGATION SCHEMES

1962-53 from the Central Government;

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) A statement showing the expenditure sanctioned for minor irrigation schemes in Parts A, B and C States from 1949-50 to 1953-54 is laid on the Table of the House. [See Appendix I, annexure No. 15.]

(b) A statement showing the estimated additional production achieved from these schemes, during the year 1949-50 to 1951-52 and the targets for the years 1952-53 and 1953-54, is also placed on the Table of the House. [See Appendix I, annexure No. 15.]

POSTAL PARCELS TO LUSHAI HILLS IN

- *71. Shri Rishang Keishing: Will the Minister of Communications be pleased to state:
- (a) whether postal parcels to Lungleh and Aijal in Lushai Hills, Assam had been stopped from November, 1952;
 - (b) if so, the reasons therefor; and
 - (c) when was it resumed?

The Deputy Minister of Communications (Shri Raj Bahadur): (a) The booking of parcels for Lungleh and Demagiri in Lushai Hills was stopped from 3rd November, 1952 to 30th April, 1953 and again from 13th June, 1953 to 27th August, 1953. The beoking of parcels for Aijal was not suspended.

- (b) The necessity for imposing a ban on booking of parcels arose on account of the difficulty in the carriage of mails.
- (c) The booking has already been resumed from 28th August 1953.
