(d) The results of the cases are not yet known.

Shri T. B. Vittal Rao: May I know, Sir, the chief reasons for this increase in the number of accidents in 1953 compared to 1952?

Shri V. V. Giri: Yes, I must admit there is a little increase. But one cannot be sure of the causes. They may be the usual causes as a result of which these accidents occur.

Shri Joachim Alva: During the last Session I enquired of the hon. Minister what were the modern devices they were adopting for the security of workers in these mines. I want to ask Government whether they merely rely on the reports of inspectors and busy themselves after an accident or are they looking for up-to-date devices for security of workers in the mines.

Shri V. V. Giri: After an accident occurs, immediately enquiry is made and the whole matter is examined. And apart from it, the authorities are very careful to see that similar accidents do not occur. On the other hand, we are thinking of an expert committee to go into these matters also.

Shri T. B. Vittal Rao: May I know whether in some cases the trial could not be proceeded with due to the absence of the Inspector of Mines at the time of the trial?

Shri V. V. Giri: If the Inspector of Mines is not there, the Deputy Inspector goes. But generally the Inspectors of Mines makes it a point to rush to the place.

RAILWAY WAGONS

Shri T. B. Vittal Rao: May I have the specific figure regarding the cost of the wagon?

Shri Alagesan: I do not have the figures here. But I can supply them to the hon. Member.

Shri T. K. Chaudhuri: What is the estimated requirement of wagons all over India in all the railways?

Shri Shahnawaz Khan: Sir, the annual replacement requirements of this country are 5,000 wagons, but we are in arrears on account of the last war by 30,920 wagons.
