released has been absorbed in another industry or has been repatriated?

Shri B. R. Bhagat: The amount released from what?

Shri S. N. Das: The amount released or withdrawn from the textile mills.

Shri B. R. Bhagat: During this period, the capital repatriation amounted to Rs. 53.41 lakhs from the textile industry.

TRIBAL FOOD MICROBIOLOGY

*1491. Shri S. C. Samanta: Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

- (a) whether investigations have been carried on tribal food microbiology;
- (b) if so, the names of places where such dietary surveys were made; and
- (c) the food found to be common to all tribals and its contents?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Education (Dr. M. M. Das):

- (a) Yes.
- (b) Abor Hills, Assam and Travancore Hills.
- (c) Rice is the common food taken by the tribes in Abor Hills and Travancore Hills. I may add that there is another very striking similarity between these two groups of tribals regarding food; neither the tribals in Assam in Abor Hills nor the tribals in Travancore take milk.
- **Shri S. C. Samanta:** What is the agency that carries out these investigations and how are they financed?
- Dr. M. M. Das: These investigations are carried out as part of the normal duties of our Anthropological Department and the money for the expenditure comes from the Budget grants given to the department.
- Shri S. C. Samanta: May I know whether any attempt has been made to find the cause of goitre prevalent among the tribals in Abor Hills, and

whether any remedial measures have been carried out?

Dr. M. M. Das: Investigation is going on about this abnormal frequency of goitre among certain tribal people in the Abor Hills and the food soil, vegitables and other local beverages prepared by the people have been taken for examination and the investigation is still going on.

ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF COLLEGE

*1492. Shri M. L. Dwivedi: Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the two sub-committees set up by the Planning Committee of the All-India Council for Technical Education in December 1953 to prepare a plan for the proposed Administrative Staff College and the National Institute of Management of India have started their work; and
- (b) what is the estimated nonrecurring and recurring expenditure in connection with the establishment of the College and the Institute?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Education (Dr. M. M. Das):
(a) Yes.

(b) Estimates of cost are still being worked out by the sub-committees.

भी एम० एल० हिबेबी: मैं यह जानना चाहता हूं कि इस इंस्टीट्यूट भीर कालेज के क्या मकासिद और उद्देश्य हैं?

Dr. M. M. Das: So far as the Administrative Staff Colleg is concerned, its main purpose is to bring together men and women of executive responsibility from industry, commerce, trade unions and the Central and State Governments to study the common principles that underlie effective administration. as the National Institute Management is concerned, the main is to raise the standards management throughout the country and to this end, among other things, it will undertake research and propaganda. It will help to create for industry and commerce a continuous supply of good managers and will stimulate a lively appreciation of the importance of effective management of all levels by all concerned.

श्री एम० एल० द्विवेदी: इस बात की महेनजर रसते हुए कि इस मुल्क में सरकारी और गैर सरकारी उद्योग और घन्षे इस जमाने में काफी उन्ति कर रहे हैं, सरकार इस बारे में क्या इन्तजाम कर रही है कि ऐसे उद्योग घन्धें के प्रबन्ध की शिक्षा के सम्बन्ध में जल्दी इन्तजाम किया जाय?

[The Minister of Education and Natural Resources and Scientific Research (Maulana Azad): That is why this scheme has been started.]

Shri L. N. Mishra: May I know whether it is a fact that this college is going to be on the model of the college in the United Kingdom?

Dr. M. M. Das: Yes, Sir.

Shri K. P. Tripathi: May I know if it has come to the notice of the Government that the Productivity Study Committee of the I.L.O. has passed strictures on the management of industries in India; if so whether the Government would consider starting this institution very quickly?

Dr. M. M. Das: Government wants to start it very quickly. A Committee has been appointed under the Minister of Commerce and Industry, Shri T. T. Krishnamachari, so that this college may come into existence without further delay.

Shri N. M. Lingam: The All-India Council for Technical Education has set up a Joint Committee of the All-India Board of Technical Studies to prepare a plan for the organisation and development of the management studies and Administrative Staff College.....

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: What is it? The hon. Member is giving the information.

Shri N. M. Lingam: The question comes last. The Joint Committee set up a Planning Committee. The Planning Committee has in its turn appointed two sub-committees. May I know how long will this process of setting up committees go on and if there is any finality about it?

Dr. M. M. Das: Only three months; within three months they will finish their deliberations.

Shri B. S. Murthy: May I know whether this college will be affiliated to any University?

Dr. M. M. Das: No; they will be an altogether different institution.

REFUGEES OF FOREIGN NATIONALITIES

*1493. Pandit D. N. Tiwary: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) whether any record is kept of refugees of foreign nationalities who are in India; and

(b) whether it is a fact that a new form of travel document is proposed to be introduced for them?

The Deputy Minister of Home Affairs (Shri Datar): (a) Except that they are registered as "Stateless Persons" no separate record of foreign refugees as such is maintained. The number of persons registered as Stateless on the 31st December 1953 is 232.

(b) No.

Pandit D. N. Tiwary: May I know in what States they have been settled?

Shri Datar: In different parts of India.
