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(d) whether Government have explored the possibilities of new markets for this commodity?

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The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): (a) and (b). There is no evidence of any real slump in the mica industry. Leaving out 1951-52, the period of stock-piling when there was an unusual rush to obtain supplies, the overall level of exports has been fairly well-maintained.

With the disappearance of a sellers' market, there is no doubt a demand from buyers that supplies should be made according to higher standards of quality.

(c) and (d). For stabilising the industry, Government have been advised that the quality for export should be improved by adopting a universal standard for grading mica. Action is being taken in this direction.

Other suggestions include:-

- Creation of central organisation for taking over export operations; and
- (2) Promotion of research work to encourage use of mica in the country.

These suggestions are under examination and no decision has been reached. Wherever possible, this item is included for Export in Trade Agreements with foreign countries.

GOVERNMENT TEST HOUSE, ALIPORE

*912. Shri Tulsidas: Will the Minister of Works, Housing and Supply be pleased to state why the testing facilities available at the Indian School of Mines, Dhanbad, are not being utilised by Government to supplement the efforts of the Government Test House at Alipore in order to minimise overloading and the resultant delay in the latter?

The Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Sardar Swaran Singh): For maintaining uniformity of standards it is desirable that testing to specifications is carried out by a single Central Testing Authority. I am not

aware that the capacity of the Government Test House, Alipore, is overleaded to such an extent as to cause concern on the score of delay.

कालीन उद्योग

*९१३. श्री आर॰ एन० सिह: क्या वाणिज्य तथा उद्योग मंत्री यह बताने की कृपा करेंगे कि क्या सरकार ने भारत में कालीन उद्योग के विकास के लिये कोई योजना बनाई है?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): Schemes for assistance to the carpet industry have been prepared by some State Governments and they have asked for financial assistance from the Centre. This request is under consideration.

WEAVERS' COLONIES

- *914. Shri Gadilingana Gowd: Wili the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:
- (a) the total amount of loan given to former Madras State from 1946 till the end of September, 1953 for construction of weavers' colonies; and
- (b) whether it is a fact that instalments of loans were not re-paid regularly consequent on the failure of weavers' societies to re-pay the loans to the State?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamacharl):
(a) So far as the Government of India are concerned, the answer is in the negative.

(b) Does not arise.

Dhoties AND Sarces

- *917. Shri Ramananda Das: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government are aware that the prices of dhoties and sarces have recently gone up in West Bengal and people are finding it difficult to procure them at reasonable prices;

- (b) if so, what are the reasons therefor; and
- (c) what action Government propose to take to bring down the prices of dhoties and surees in West Bengal?

The Ministry of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari):
(a) to (c). The West Bengal Government have informed the Government of India that there has been some rise in the prices of dhoties and sarees, which could not be attributed, according to their report, to any local shortage. There are, therefore, no apparent reasons for such a rise. The reasons for this rise are being investigated.

LOANS TO TEA GARDENS

- *923. Shri K. P. Tripathi: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:
- (a) the total amount guaranteed against loss to banks in 1952 and 1953 for advancing loans to tea gardens of India, State-wise;
- (b) the loss actually incurred on this account by Government in 1953 and 1954, State-wise;
- (c) whether any tax relief was also granted to these gardens; and
- (d) if so, what (State and yearwise)?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): (a) The Government limited guarantee scheme to banks in respect of advances to tea gardens is applicable to 1953-54 tea season only. As the 1953-54 tea season will run upto 31st March, 1954, the total amount coming under the purview of Government's guarantee cannot be calculated till that date.

- (b) So far no loss has been incurred by Government.
- (c) and (d). A direct relief to tea gardens was re-adjustment of excise duty levied on tea. With effect from 15th April, 1953 the excise duty levied on tea was reduced from three annas to one anna per pound on loose tea released from tea gardens.

- *924. Shri Bheekha Bhai: Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting pe pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that a pamphlet entitled 'Building New India' has been published in Urdu; and
- (b) whether Government have issued the pamphlet in other regional languages also?

The Minister of Information and Broadcasting (Dr. Keskar): (a) Yes.

- *925. Shri B. S. Murthy: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) the number of Indians who have acquired the citizenship rights of Burma so far;
- (b) the political concessions, or special rights, if any, given to Indians in Burma; and
- (c) whether recognition is given to Indian Trade Unions in Burma?

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shri Anii K. Chanda): (a) to (c). The Government of India's information on these points is incomplete. Efforts are being made, however, to collect all available data through the Embassy of India in Burma. The material, when received, will be placed on the Table of the House.

NEEM OIL FOR SOAP

*927. Shrimati Jayashri: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the Khadi and Village Industries Board has suggested the possibility of utilising the oil extracted from neem fruits (neem oil) in the preparation of soap?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari): Yes, Sir.
