(b) 37 passengers and 19 Railway servants were injured.

Engines, Rolling-stock, Permanent Way, and other Railway equipment sustained damage of varying degrees.

(c) The approximate cost of damage to Railway property was Rs. 3,07,175.

- (c) The amount of compensation paid during the year 1953 was Rs. 3,07,85,454.
