by geologists and their opinions obtained;

(b) if not, the reasons therefor;

(c) when the work of laying the concrete foundation at Maithon is scheduled to start; and

(d) the reasons for the delay in the commencement of the work?

The Deputy Minister of Irrigation and Power (Shri Hathi): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) The work was started on the 12th Feb., 1954.

(d) Non-receipt of certain essential Machinery and spare parts in time, from foreign countries.

IMPORT LICENCES FOR BICYCLE PARTS

*2037. Shri B. N. Misra: (a) Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the sale of bicycle parts imported under the Actual User's licence to others in the market is prohibited?

(b) Are Government aware that such sales are taking place?

(c) If the answer to part (b) above be in affirmative, what action have Government taken against those firms who are violating the conditions of the Actual User's Licence?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c). Some complaints were received about the sale of cycle parts by manufacturers but the charges could not be established.
