The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shri Anil K. Chanda): (a) and (b). A large number of French Military & Civil aircraft pass through Dum Dum. All aircraft which land at that airport are checked before they depart. Sometime ago a French civil aircraft was found carrying military stores. As such aircraft are not allowed under our rules to carry military stores, it had to be detained for a apecial check.

(c) and (d). A number of passengers were found to be carrying articles of military uniforms with them. Some of them had sealed covers and other documents addressed to or emanating from the military authorities. Steel helmets were found with 6 passengers 3 revolvers were also found in the baggage and 3 of the passengers carried ammunition as well.

The aircraft also carried cargo which included some packages of stretchers and films. 4 boxes contained SKF Bearings. Besides there were 20 unmanifested packages.

All objectionable articles in the cargo as well as in the baggage were removed from the aircraft after which it was allowed to depart.

Shrimati Tarkeshwari Sinha: May I know how many passengers there were in that aircraft and whether were Red Cross personnel or regular military men?

Shri Anil K. Chanda: There were altogether 84 passengers in that aircraft, and all except one claimed to be civilians.

Shrimati Tarkeshwari Sinha: May I know whether the same plane was detained at Palam and, if so, whether any search was conducted at that time?

Shri Anil K. Chanda: No. Sir. this identical plane was not detained at Palam.

Shri Thimmaiah: May I know whether the ammunition found in the aircraft was confiscated or returned to the French authorities?

Shri Anii K. Chanda: These articles were dealt with according to the law.

SABARMATI RIVER VALLEY PROJECT

*287. Shri Dabhi: Will the Minister of Irrigation and Power be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Central Water and Power Commission had forwarded a copy of its report on the Sabarmati River Valley Project to the Bombay Government;
