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(c) whether any progress has been achieved in the sector of small-scale industries since this assistance has been granted; and

(d) whether Government contemplate to take any other steps to encourage the development of smallscale industries?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kærmarkær): (a) Hitherto, the Central Government have given assistance only to Part C States under the State Aid to Industries (Centrally Administered Areas) Model Rules, 1949. In most Part A and B States, arrangements exist for providing financial and other assistance to cottage and small-scale industries under various State Aid to Industries Acts or non-statutory Rules by the State Governments themselves.

(b) It is understood that most of the State Governments have made provision for financial and other assistance to the small-scale industries in their current year's budgets.

(c) and (d). Yes, Sir.

TANNING INDUSTRY IN TRIPURA

*307. Shri Dasaratha Deb: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government contemplate to start tanning industry in Tripura:

(b) if so, what are its prospects in Tripura; and

(c) the estimated amount that would be spent on this industry in Tripura?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): (a) to (c). The Government of Tripura have a scheme for imparting training in Tanning and they expect the individuals so trained to develop the Tanning Industry, individually or on a co-operative basis. DISPLACED PERSONS IN MANIPUR

*315. Shri Rishang Keishing: Will' the Minister of Rehabilitation be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a large number of displaced persons from East Pakistan have recently arrived in Manipur;

(b) if so, their total number;

(c) the measures that Government have taken for their rehabilitation; and

(d) the number of skilled workmen among them?

The Deputy Minister of Rehabilitation (Shri J. K. Bhonsle): (a) to (d). The required information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the Sabha in due course.

DIESEL ENGINES

*317. { Shri A. K. Gopalan: Shri V. P. Nayar:

Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) the reasons for the very low percentage of production of the installed capacity in diesel engines; and

(b) how many diesel engines have been bought by the Central Government during the year 1953-54 and how many of these are manufactured in India?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari): (a) The low production of dieset engines in the past was due to poor off-take of indigenous engines. The position has since changed cons.dcrably and indigenous production is gradually going up.

(b) 299 engines were purchased during 1953-54, of these 207 were indigenous.
