FOREST LAND

- 313. Dr. Ram Subhag Singh: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:
- (a) the total acreage of forest land which has been brought under cultivation since August, 1947; and
- (b) whether Government propose to bring any more forest land under cultivation during the current year?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) The Central Tractor Organisation started jungle clearance operations in the Tarai area of Uttar Pradesh in the 1950-51 reclamation season. An area of 20,265 acres has so far been made ready for ploughing, and out of this area 18,414 acres have been prepared for receiving seed in the 1951-52 season. The latter acreage will be brought under actual cultivation in the next kharif and rabi seasons.

Besides, a total area of 6,19,844 acres of forest land has been brought under cultivation in the various States since August, 1947, according to information received from the State Governments. Information has not so far been received from the Governments of U.P., Bihar and Madhya Pradesh.

(b) As far as the Central Tractor Organisation is concerned, no further operations on forest lands are proposed to be undertaken this year. According to information received from State Governments, they propose to bring 23,735 acres more of forest land under cultivation this year.
