## WRITTEN ANSWERRS TO QUESTIONS

## Imported Foodgrains

667. S Shri Jhunjhunwala:
L Pandit M. E. Bhargava:
Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:
(a) the F.O.B. price per maund of the different toodgrains from each country imported in 1951;
(b) the average retail price per maund at which the different imported toodgrains were sold to the public; and
(c) the average loss per maund of foodgrains incurred by the Centra: Government and the State Governments in distributing imported foodgrains?

- The Deputy Minister of Commerce and maustry (Shri Karmarkar): (a) It is not in the oublic interest to disclose the information asked for just at present.
(b) A statement showing the issue prices of imported foodgrains in various states during 1951 is laid on tne Taible of the House. [See Appenaix IV, annexure No. 4.]
(c) The weighted average subsidy per maund incurred by the Central Governmeat during 1951 on the sale of unported foodgrains in subsidised areas works out approximately as tollows:-

## Appointment of Scheduled Castes in

 the Services of the Union*6\%4. Shri P. N. Rajabhoj: Will the ivinister of Home Afirars be pleased to state:
(a) what orders have been issued by the Government of India to ensure the uppointment of members of Scheduled castes to services and posts under them in the proportion prescribed for the Scheduled Castes;
(b) the source, if any, to know the number of posts of all cadres to which members of Scheduled Castes are appointed, during a period of six months as against the total number of posts filled during the same period; and
(c) the number of posts of all cadres Glled by the Union Public Service Commission the Special Recruitment

Board and other recruiting authorities, separately in each case, since the 261 h January, 1950, the number reserved for the Scheduled Castes and the number of posts to which Scheduled Caste persons were actually appointed; in case the number of posts filled by Scheduled Castes persons was less than the number reserved for them, what action Government propose to take in the matter?

The Minister of Home Affairs and States (Dr. Katju): (a) The orders in this regard are contained in our Supplementary Instructions No. 42/21/49NGS dated 28th January, 1952, a copy of which is placed on the Table of the House. [Placed in the Library. See No. P.27/52.]

The substance of these orders has also been given in paragraph 15 of the Report of the Ministry of Home Affairs for 1951-52 copies of which have been circulated to Members of Parliament.
(b) There is no single source at present from which the desired information can be readily obtained. However, the various Ministries and Departments have been asked under our Supplementary Instructions to submit annual communal returns. When these are received, it will be possible to find out the number of Scheduled Castes candidates appointed in the course of a year as against the total number of posts filled during the same period.
(c) This information is not readily available. It is being collected and wiil be placed on the Table of the House in due course.

## Frequency of Arr Services (REDUCTION)

*675. Dr. Ram Subhag Singh: Will the Minister of Communications be pleased to state when the reduction in the frequency of services announced recently by the various Indian air companies as a result of the world shortage of aviation fuel is likely to be restored?
