(e) whether emigration to. Burma is still free of all regulation or any planned and regulated flow is sought to be arranged?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister (Shri Satish Chandra):
(a) The exact figure is not available but the number is estimated to be five lakhs.

- (b) Under the Burma Land Nationalisation Act, 1948, the maximum rate of compensation payable to all land-owners, including Indians, is 12 times the land revenue.
 - (c) No.
- (d) and (e). There is no minimum wage legislation in Burma except for Agricultural labourers which also applies to Indians.

Emigration to Burma is not free but is regulated under the Indian Emigration Act. Emigration of unscilled workers is banned but the emigration of skilled workers is allowed if the salaries and other terms of employment are satisfactory.

FARIDABAD TOWNSHIP
