## The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) No, Sir.

### CONSTRUCTING OF BRIDGES IN COORG

- \*1013. Shri N. Somana: (a) Will the Minister of Transport be pleased to state whether any amount is standing to the credit of the State of Coorg in the Central Road fund reserve for constructing three bridges and if so, how much?
- (b) Is the amount likely to be utilised in the current year?
  - The Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri L. B. Shastri): (a) A grant of Rs. 3½ lakhs was offered to Coorg from the Central Road Fund (Ordinary) Reserve in 1949 for constructing three bridges. The grant is still available.
- (b) A part of the grant is likely to be utilized in the current year on the construction of one of the bridges.

### Anti-malaria Work in Coorg

- \*1014. Shri N. Somana; (a) Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state whether the State of Coorg has been asked by the Government of India to bear part of the cost of Anti-malaria work to the current year and if so, what portion of the cost?
- (b) What are the reasons for the same?

The Minister of Health (Rajkumari Amrit Kaur): (a) and (b). Since 1946-47 when the anti-malaria organisation was first set up in Coorg the Central Government have been meeting the entire cost of the organisation as a special case. Normally this is an item of expenditure which should be met from the State revenues. It has, therefore, been proposed that from the current financial year the State Government should bear the cost of establishment. The cost of materials like D.D.T. will be borne by the Central Government for the time being. The State Government is being consulted.

#### CENTRAL SECRETARIAT SERVICE

- \*1815. Shri Vallatharas: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the scheme of reinforcement and the reorganisation of the Central Secretariat has been implemented; and if so to what extent;
- (b) whether a list of eligible persons for absorption or promotion to the posts of the Assistant Superintendents (grade III) and superintendents (grade II) has been prepared;
- (c) whether tests and competitive examinations were held for determining qualifications for the said eligibility;
- (d) how many among the existing Assistants (grade IV) have been taken in the final eligible list;
- (e) whether other persons besides these Assistants (grade IV) are taken on the eligible list and if so, how many; and
- (f) how many among these others are failed candidates in the tests and competitive examinations?

The Minister of Home Affairs and States (Dr. Katju): (a) The implementation of the Central Secretariat Service (Reorganisation and Reinforcement) Scheme is nearing completion in respect of Grades I to III. Appointments to Grade IV will also be completed shortly.

- (b) Lists of persons in each Ministry who were eligible to be considered under the terms of the Scheme for appointment to Grades I to III were prepared and published in 1948-49. These were considered by the Union Public Service Commission and lists of persons found suitable for appointment to each grade of the service have been received from the Commission and published.
- (c) The conditions for eligibility are prescribed in para. 20 of the Scheme copies of which are available in the Parliament Library. Recommendations regarding the suitability of officers for appointment to the various grades have been made by the Commission after considering the record of their service, supplemented where necessary by an interview. No competitive tests or examinations were laid down for the purpose.
- (d) to (f). Neither the lists of eligible candidates nor those of approved candidates have been arranged separately into those who were Assistants and those who were not. Information

regarding the number of persons who were Assistants is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House when it is ready.
