DAMODAR VALLEY PROJECT

- *1058. Shri N. P. Sinha: Will Minister of Planning and River Valley Schemes be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Damodar Valley Project is going to be completed with-in the time originally stipulated;
- (b) whether any dam, out of the proposed eight, has been completed so far:
- (c) how many families have been displaced on account of the operation of the Damodar Valley Scheme so far:
- (d) how many are likely to be displaced by the time it is completed; and
- (e) whether the displaced persons have been rehabilitated?

The Minister of Finance (Shri C. D. Deshmukh): (a) The first phase of the Damodar Scheme is scheduled to be completed by 1955. Every endeavour will be made to adhere to the target date.

- (b) The first phase of the Scheme includes, construction of four dams only viz. Tilaiya, Konar, Maithon and Panchet Hill. Of these Tilaiya will be completed this year and Konar next year.
- (c) 81 families have been displaced so far.
- (d) 10,000 families are likely to be affected by all the 8 dams and Thermal Power Station.
 - (e) The answer is in the affirmative.
- Shri N. P. Sinha: May I ask if the Corporation proposes to hand over charge of rehabilitation to the State Government of Bihar as suggested by the Estimates Committee in its 8th report?

- Shri C. D. Deshmukh: This and the other recommendations of the Estimates Committee are under consideration
- Shri N. P. Sinha: May I also ask how much land in Bihar is likely to be irrigated by the project when completed?
- Shri C. D. Deshmukh: I would like notice of that question.
- Prof. Agarwal: May I know what are the latest estimates of the D.V.C.?
 - Shri C. D. Deshmukh: I think the whole matter will come up for discussion later this morning. I will only say it is round about Rs. 90 crores.
 - Shri B. K. Das: May I know whether the original target date was fixed at five years after beginning the work and not 1955? Is it a fact that this target date of 1955 has been fixed later?
 - Shri C. D. Deshmukh: I should like to have notice as to the exact date given in the original estimates.
