(b) Rs. 33.6 lakhs.

(c) No, Sir.

(e) Some of the valves in these transmitters have been found to have developed defects while in storage.

WOOL

***1079. Shri Balwant Sinha Mehta:** Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) the total quantity of wool produced in India and the percentage thereof produced in Rajasthan; and

(b) whether the traders of Rajasthan have been allowed to export wool outside India in proportion to the production there?

The Deputy Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Karmarkar): (a) The annual production of wool in India is estimated at 54:53 million lbs a year and Rajasthan's share is 32:5 per cent.

(b) Wool is being licensed freely for export valid for shipment upto 31s
