FOREIGN EMPLOYEES IN INDIAN EMBASSIES

225. Prof. Agarwal: Will the **Prime** Minister be pleased to state:

(a) how many foreign employees nationality-wise, are still working in our Embassies abroad;

(b) whether there is any scheme of replacing them gradually by Indian officers; and

(c) how many Indian employees in our Embassies have a working knowledge of Hindi?

The Prime Minister (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): (a) and (c). Information is being collected and a statement will be laid on the Table of the House as soon as the details are available.

(b) There are general orders that as far as possible recruitment should be restricted to Indians. In accordance with these orders and as part of the basic principles on which the Indian Foreign Service has been formed, non-Indians are being retained or employed in our Missions and posts abroad, in subordinate capacities, only where administrative and financial considerations render it absolutely necessary. The Indian Foreign Service itself is manned entirely by Indians.

The Minister of Finance (Shri C. D. Deshmukh): The conference approved of the estimates of the Maithon Project. It was decided that the height of the Maithon Dam shall be at R.L. 500. As regards Panchet Hill Dam. the Damodar Valley Corporation were asked to prepare a detailed estimate within two months and obtain the approval of the participating Governments.
